What is a Family Care Home?

JHSNI Family Caregivers provide safe and supportive homes to young people in our Headstart, Oasis, 180 Degrees Detox and Stabilization, and Youth Justice Beds programs. Family care homes are integral to the success of our community-based programming.



Becoming a **family caregiver** gives you an opportunity to make a difference while working from home. **Family caregivers** are paid contractors, receiving a non-taxable retainer and per diem fees, 24-hour on-call support, ongoing training, and monthly respite.

Caregivers provide encouragement and supervision to youth placed in their homes. The emphasis is on building positive relationships and fostering a nurturing family environment. We have openings for **family care homes** in Campbell River and the Comox Valley.

Who Are the Youth?

- Young men and women ages 12-19 with a variety of needs
- All of the youth need a stable, caring family environment
- As each of our young client's situations is unique, we look for a diverse group of family caregivers
- The length of stay depends on the program



Do Caregivers Receive Training?

Yes! Initial training involves:

- Meeting the team
- Orientation to the program
- Information and education
- Guidelines and standards for families

Following initial training:
